Problem and Strategy (1)

- Illustration of the implementation of quality-assured GM in the public tender and selection procedures – considering as an example of the Austrian public procurement law
 - → objective to move from the principle of the cheapest offer to the principle of the best offer



Problem and Strategy (2)

The problem is based on the fact that in the (Austrian) procedure of public tender

- calls for tender follow the principle of the cheapest offer which implies that no (reduced) quality claims can be raised
- calls for tender include a requirement for "gender expertise", without defining or reaching a consensus about what exactly is meant by this
- → Both strategies affect the quality of *GM* as an equal strategy negatively



Problem and Strategy (3)

Target groups

- Trialogue between
 - contracting authority
 - applying organisations and their target groups
 - experts

International relevance

 Principles of public contracting by tender are EU-based and the problems to increase the quality in the tender process are similar within the EU, although there are national differences
